### **RELIGION**

Our school Religious Education Programme is based on units of work which cover areas relevant to the children's lives. The programme is systematic and sequenced, helping children to relate our Catholic faith to their daily lives.

Our topics in Term 1 are "Church" and "Lent and Easter".

### **ENGLISH**

We have a daily Dedicated Literacy Time. Literacy tasks aim to develop in all children the ability to communicate efficiently in all areas; Reading, Speaking, Listening, Writing and Viewing. The Talk for Writing programme is used to assist children to become successful story-tellers and writers. During the year various strategies will be used to achieve success. Integration across all curriculum areas will occur whenever possible.

#### **Reading**

Our aim is to encourage children to enjoy reading and to gain confidence in their own reading abilities.

Assist your child to reflect, understand and comprehend their home reader by asking appropriate questions.

Questions should focus on the Who, What, Where, When and Why of the story.

#### **Phonics/Spelling: Whole School Diana Rigg Approach**

Children work at their own level to learn various sounds and words.

#### **Writing - Talk for Writing Approach**

The writing genres of narratives, recounts, reports, expositions, poetry and procedures are taught throughout the year.

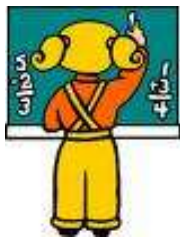
#### **Handwriting- New South Wales Pre-Cursive Writing**

During the year children will be taught the correct formation of letters and numbers.



**MATHEMATICS:**

The Year Two programme uses a hands-on investigative approach using concrete materials.



**Number:** The four operations (Add, Subtract, Divide and Multiply), patterns and fractions will continue to be developed and reinforced.

**Measurement:** looks at length, area, volume and capacity, mass and time concepts.

**Space:** looks at shapes (2D and 3D), paths and positions, maps and investigations.

It will greatly assist your child if you give him/her experiences handling money and telling time on both analogue and digital clocks.

**HISTORY- Mrs Elliot/Mrs Rodriguez    GEOGRAPHY: Mr Schelfhout**

These learning areas will help to increase the children's knowledge and understanding about their local community and environment and provide them with opportunities to question, analyse, evaluate and reflect on their learning. Our term 1 theme is 'Creating a profile on a person and a place in the local community and discover what it reveals about the past.'



**SCIENCE- Mr Bernie Schelfhout**

Children will explore science concepts through specific themes. They will also apply knowledge, skills and resources to the development of technological solutions. Our emphasis is on the hands on approach and collaborative learning using the Primary Connections Programme.

**HEALTH- Mrs Sparks (2 Gold) Mrs Elliot (2 Blue)**



There are three broad areas addressed in the Health programme. These are:

- Concepts for a Healthy Lifestyle, Self-Management Skills and Interpersonal Skills.

We will also cover the 'Keeping Safe Child Protection Curriculum' which covers the four topics: The right to be safe; relationships, recognising and reporting abuse and protective strategies.

**DIGITAL TECHNOLOGY-** Children will learn the parts of a computer, to represent simple patterns in data, design solutions to problems and present ideas and information using various safe digital systems.

**ART-** Creating art work is a means of expressing ideas and feelings. It helps children to develop fine motor skills, creativity and appreciation of others' work.

**EMOTIONAL INTELLIGENCE -** Children will be taught the 'Zones of Regulation' using a four point scale to help them understand their feelings and the associated behaviours. They will be given a range of tools to use to help them develop coping strategies, responsible behaviour and resilience when dealing with daily experiences and challenges.

**PHYSICAL EDUCATION - Ms Juliette Borromei**

During the year both Year Two classes will have sport on **Thursdays**.

Swimming lessons will be conducted in Term 1 during weeks 7 and 8.

**LIBRARY** browsing day will be on **Tuesdays** for both classes.

On Library browse days, students will need to return their books and bring their library bag for borrowing. (No bag, no borrow)

**HOMEWORK** - In order to combine practising concepts learnt at school with developing other life skills, homework grids will be utilised. Grids will be handed out and completed fortnightly and will contain a mixture of activities. Reading will be compulsory each night, whilst other activities can be undertaken on a day of your choosing. Please remember to sign each activity once it's completed.

- The digital portfolio Seesaw will be used as a communication tool to share your child's learning and to send messages and reminders.
- Newsletters are distributed fortnightly. It is very important that you read these and return any relevant notes promptly.
- Parents are asked to make appointments for parent/teacher meetings or you can email or message via Seesaw.
- Please send a written note to the school to cover your child's absence as this is a legal requirement. We would appreciate being advised early of a planned absence as this may affect our daily planning.
- You will receive a text message if your child is not at school.
