Listed below are the content and skills that will be covered in the major subject areas this term.

Religious Education

The students will continue with the Unit “Stirred through Emotion” to start the term. Following this, the children will work through the Unit entitled “Loving Like Jesus” which corresponds with a day seminar that the students will participate in entitled “Loving for Life”. This workshop promotes an awareness of Christian sexuality and relationships. There will be more details about this program in coming letters. To end the school year, the children will work through the Unit entitled “Come Be Reconciled” in preparation for Advent and the Christmas celebration.



Numeracy

During the Mathematics program, students will endeavour to increase their understanding across all of the Numeracy Strands. Some main learning points will include: working with decimals and percentages of money to find discounts and develop budgets, examining and creating nets for 3-D shapes; investigating a number of aspects involved in angles; Solve problems involving the comparison of lengths and areas using appropriate units and conducting chance experiments and working with probability. We will also continue to review key points from the Year 6 Mathematics curriculum to best prepare the students for secondary school.



English

- Children to continue with their Diana Rigg spelling program
- Literature Circles will continue as well as studying “*The Cay*” by Theodore Taylor, a book set in the Caribbean during World War Two which touches on the issues of racism.
- Discuss the purpose and structure of persuasive texts by following the seven steps to effective persuasive writing. Our topic will be why camp should never be discontinued.
- Discuss the purpose and structure of discussion writing and drawing comparisons between this style and persuasive writing.
- Discuss and design an effective movie poster. This will lead onto the creation of a script and the making of a short movie scene.



Society & Environment Civics and Economics



Students will continue to build on their understanding of the concepts of justice, rights and responsibilities, and the Westminster system. They investigate Australia's democratic system of government, including state/territory and federal parliaments, and the court system. Students examine Australian citizenship, and the rights and responsibilities that being a citizen entails. Students will also be introduced to the fundamentals of economics, investigating opportunity cost and the key terms to develop their knowledge and understanding for their future.



Health (Mr.Chris Barrett & Ms Philippa Wicksey)

During this term students will be learning about a number of aspects including being able to identify and explain the physical, social and emotional effects of healthy eating and lifestyle choices (substances) as well as developing the ability to plan for and practise responsible decision-making in order to promote health, safety and well-being. Students will also begin to develop skills to establish and manage relationships in a variety of difficult situations.

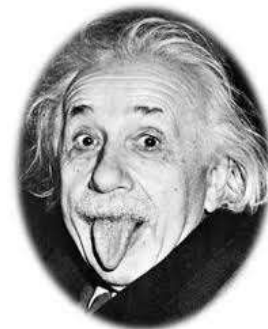
Science (Mr Bernie Schelfhout)

The students will be covering a unit entitled "*Marvellous Micro-organisms*" in Science this term. This unit will ask the pupils to explain:

- That Living things have basic needs, including food and water.

Additionally, the pupils will:

- Formulate a question for investigation and make a prediction.
- Plan investigations showing an awareness of the need for fair testing.
