Dear Parents,

It has been wonderful to see our students returning to St Anthony's safe and well. They have certainly missed their friends, school and teachers. Presently we will continue to follow the directions of Catholic Education Western Australia and the Department of Health, and continue to drop off and pick up students at the respective car parks. The students have handled the situation extremely well as I am sure it is disconcerting for many parents and children, not having their parents walk them to the classroom. The resilience and responsibility our St Anthony's students have shown is commendable.

We have been particularly impressed with our kindergarten and pre-primary students who have greeted staff with a confident smile each day. I am pleased to report that our students are settling into the routines of the classroom soon after arrival. This is another sign of their resilience and respect for the school's expectations.

Due to an increased expression of interest in our three-year-old pre-kindergarten class, we will be recommencing the programme in Semester Two and are currently in the process of holding interviews. The interview process for our 2021 four-year-old kindergarten programme is underway and applicants are encouraged to contact the office at their earliest convenience.

School Expectations

As parents and students are aware the school has a Student Code of Conduct" based on our core values "Act Justly, Love Tenderly. Walk Humbly". The student Code of Conduct can be found on our website: <https://www.stanthonysgreen.wa.edu.au/> It represents our beliefs and sentiments about behaviour. The website also has a link to our "Vision for Learning" which has been formulated to ensure our children are natured to be collaborative critical and innovative learners. I encouraged parents to visit these school visions and discuss with their children.

Our school is planning to focus on sustainability in the coming months. Each teacher will be conducting a waste audit next week within their own classroom. Waste audits provide an opportunity to find out how much and what type of waste is produced by our school. This information can then give us an idea of where to begin our waste minimisation efforts, for example what type of recycling to implement or what type of waste to reduce.

The process of conducting a waste audit, the need for waste audits and the findings from this are also embedded within our programming and planning for this term. When participating in the waste audit, the students will sort the waste into different categories and graph the results. With a focus on the largest categories, the students will then collaboratively develop a plan to reduce waste in these areas.

Waste audits are carefully planned and the safety of students conducting the audit is paramount. Due to COVID19 the students will not be handling waste, rather creating a tally. The main goals are to become more aware of the waste we produce and to develop ways to reduce the amount of waste we would normally throw away. Conducting a waste audit is the first step to reducing waste in our school and playing our part in making our planet a healthier place to live.

Once classrooms come up with initiatives more information will be provided through the newsletter and/or SEESAW in coming weeks. Thank you for your support.

SCHOOL FEES

Aurelia Cooper will be managing the school fees this year. Please direct any queries directly to Aurelia.

There has recently been public and media attention regarding fees in Catholic schools and a suggestion that parents should receive discounts. I would respectfully like to make the following points:

1. Parents have been guaranteed that their child's place at St Anthony's School is guaranteed regardless of a parent's financial situation. I have already provided you with information regarding fee relief and information regarding the Health Care Card discount scheme. I encourage you to contact me directly if you have any concerns regarding school fees. Any such arrangements are, of course, confidential.
2. Our school has already refunded/credited you the cost of any events or activities that you have been charged for and which are now not occurring.

It is important for all parents to know that St. Anthony's stand ready to support all families, especially those for whom fees are a concern. Please contact the Principal, Greg Green if fees are a problem.

Direct Debit Payments: Families wishing to pay their fees via Direct Debit need to complete a Direct Debit form which are available from the school office or from the school website. Families who would like a suggested amount calculated are asked to contact the school office. Please refer to the school fees policy for information regarding direct debits.

ADMINISTRATION OF SCHOOLS (AoS)

Catholic Education Western Australia (CEWA) has committed to a new Administration software platform that has been a work in progress for the last couple of years.

As the demands of modern schools increase, the services required to support schools increase faster still. AoS (Admin of Schools) is a comprehensive engine designed to integrate all of these services and unite them in one central management system. St Anthony's School Administrative Staff have been working with staff from CEWA in preparation for the installation of AoS, to replace our current Administration system.

Please be aware that this will occur as of Friday 12th June 2020.

There will be several changes such as a new BPAY reference number and SEQTA logins.

BPAY reference number:

We will send you a Fee Statement showing your current balance. After we have transitioned to the new system you be issued with a new BPAY reference number. You will then be required to update your bank reference number on your bank account for future BPAY payments.

SEQTA Engage:

We will send Parents/ Carers a link to setup their accounts. All families are required to setup their new account within a week of receiving the link in order to access past reports. Please ensure you keep your username and password, in order to use this again at the end of the year.

We appreciate your patience during the transition period.

ST ANTHONY'S SCHOOL ABSENTEE LINE - 9294 5535

If you have notified the school that your child will be attending school this term and they are then absent from school, please ensure that you following the normal procedures to notify the school that your child will be absent:

Parents are asked to ring the Absentee Line on **9294 5535** by 8.30am on the day of absence and leave the following information:

- Full Name of Student
- Year/Class (eg 1G)
- Reason for absence and expected length of absence
- Your name and relationship to the student

As part of our school's duty of care, if you have not notified the school office or your child's class teacher of their absence, you will be notified via an SMS that your child has been recorded as being absent. On receipt of the SMS, please contact the school office to confirm their absence. **All** absences will need to be followed up with a written note to the OFFICE, or an email sent to admin@stanthonygreen.wa.edu.au

All absences require a written explanation for auditing purposes.

LATE ARRIVALS

If your child is arriving late to school, they are require to be signed in at the school office by the parent/carer.

STUDENT APPOINTMENTS

Children who need to leave the school during school hours (eg: for appointments with doctor, dentist etc) need to be signed out at the school office by the parent/carer and then signed in when they return to school from their appointment.

The Kindergarten operates 3 days a week and limited places are currently available for 2021. Interviews will take place in the near future.

Interviews will take place later in the year, so if you are interested in your child joining this program you will need to fill out an enrolment form which are available from the school office or on the school's website. PICK UP AND DROP OFF PROCEDURES – TERM 2

Pick-up and Drop off:

Parents and caregivers are not permitted on school property other than to drop off or pick up their children, at which time they must not exit their vehicle except to assist young students to alight or board the vehicle. If parents and caregivers are walking their children to and from school, they should undertake their drop off or pick up in the same area.

Morning Drop Off

(Upper Car Park ONLY for all students)

- Students are to be dropped off at the upper car park between 8:30am and 8:50am.
- Parents are asked to drop their child off in the flow through lane and refrain from parking.
- Young students may require assistance from their parents in alighting from the car.
- All students will be met by a staff member and escorted or directed to their classroom
- Children from Before School Care will be escorted or directed to their classroom.

Afternoon Pick Up

(Upper Car Park for Lower Years ~ Kindy to Year 3 students)

(Lower Car Park for Upper Years ~ Year 4 to 6 students)

- Kindergarten students will be escorted to the upper school pick up area for collection at 2.30pm where parents are asked to collect their child in the flow through lane and refrain from parking. Kindergarten students who have older siblings – parents wishing to collect the older siblings at 2.30pm, please email the school to advise that you would like them to be at the pick to be collected at 2.30pm
- Pre-Primary to Year 3 students are to be picked up at the upper school car park between 3:00pm and 3:20pm. Parents are asked to pick their child up in the flow through lane and refrain from parking.
- Year 4 to Year 6 students are to be picked up at the lower school car park between 3:00pm and 3:20pm. Parents are asked to pick their child up in the flow through lane and refrain from parking. Younger siblings
- Young students may require assistance from their parents in getting into the car
- All students will be escorted or directed to the car park and supervised until safely picked up by their parents or caregivers.
- Students attending After School Care will be escorted or directed to the Hall.
