Dear Parents

The students have been introduced to the Zones of Regulation this term. Although each class is implementing strategies that are developmentally appropriate there is a common approach across all year levels

Zones of regulation is a curriculum designed to help children independently self-regulate their actions by teaching them to recognize how their body is feeling. They use colours to explain the different emotions. By teaching these zones, students can learn to increase communication initiations by sharing how they are feeling and what activities they need to do to help them stay in the green zone

· Green zone- calm, ready, happy, focused, content



· Blue zone- tired, sleepy, bored, sad



· Yellow zone- excited, anxious, nervous, surprised, worried, silly



· Red zone- furious, angry, rage, out of control



The children develop a number of strategies they can use to increase their well being and that of their class mates. These strategies are often documented by the student for easy reference when needed.

Making Jesus Real (MJR) is a programme designed to foster a relationship with Jesus that is real to the students and relevant to their daily lives. An important aspect of MJR is learning how to recognise God Moments in encounters with our friends, families and nature.

Making Jesus Real is specifically linked to the school policies and teaching and learning programmes across all Key Learning Areas. The values of care and compassion, respect, honesty and trustworthiness, understanding, tolerance and inclusion are highlighted. These values also encourage students to do their best, treat others fairly, be responsible for their actions and follow school rules and procedures.

SCHOOL FEES

There has recently been public and media attention regarding fees in Catholic schools and a suggestion that parents should receive discounts. I would respectfully like to make the following points:

1. Parents have been guaranteed that their child's place at St Anthony's School is guaranteed regardless of a parent's financial situation. I have already provided you with information regarding fee relief and information regarding the Health Care Card discount scheme. I encourage you to contact me directly if you have any concerns regarding school fees. Any such arrangements are, of course, confidential.
2. Our school has already refunded/credited you the cost of any events or activities that you have been charged for and which are now not occurring.

It is important for all parents to know that St. Anthony's stand ready to support all families, especially those for whom fees are a concern. Please contact the Principal, Greg Green if fees are a problem.

Direct Debit Payments: Families wishing to pay their fees via Direct Debit need to complete a Direct Debit form which are available from the school office or from the school website. Families who would like a suggested amount calculated are asked to contact the school office. Please refer to the school fees policy for information regarding direct debits.

ADMINISTRATION OF SCHOOLS (AoS)

Catholic Education Western Australia (CEWA) has committed to a new Administration software platform that has been a work in progress for the last couple of years.

As the demands of modern schools increase, the services required to support schools increase faster still. AoS (Admin of Schools) is a comprehensive engine designed to integrate all of these services and unite them in one central management system. St Anthony's School Administrative Staff have been working with staff from CEWA in preparation for the installation of AoS, to replace our current Administration system.

The change-over to the new system will occur as of Friday 12th June 2020.

There will be several changes such as a new BPAY reference number and SEQTA logins.

Change to the BPAY reference number:

A new statement will be sent with your new BPay reference number. Please ensure that you amend this reference number on your bank records to ensure it is applied to your account.

SEQTA Engage:

We will send Parents/ Carers a link to setup their accounts. All families are required to setup their new account within a week of receiving the link in order to access past reports. Please ensure you keep your username and password, in order to use this again at the end of the year.

We appreciate your patience during the transition period.

ST ANTHONY'S SCHOOL ABSENTEE LINE - 9294 5535

If you have notified the school that your child will be attending school this term and they are then absent from school, please ensure that you following the normal procedures to notify the school that your child will be absent:

Parents are asked to ring the Absentee Line on **9294 5535** by 8.30am on the day of absence and leave the following information:

- Full Name of Student
- Year/Class (eg 1G)
- Reason for absence and expected length of absence
- Your name and relationship to the student

As part of our school's duty of care, if you have not notified the school office or your child's class teacher of their absence, you will be notified via an SMS that your child has been recorded as being absent. On receipt of the SMS, please contact the school office to confirm their absence. **All** absences will need to be followed up with a written note to the OFFICE, or an email sent to admin@stanthonysgreen.wa.edu.au

All absences require a written explanation for auditing purposes.

LATE ARRIVALS

If your child is arriving late to school, they are require to be signed in at the school office by the parent/carer.

STUDENT APPOINTMENTS

Children who need to leave the school during school hours (eg: for appointments with doctor, dentist etc) need to be signed out at the school office by the parent/carer and then signed in when they return to school from their appointment.

The Kindergarten operates 3 days a week and limited places are currently available for 2021. Interviews will take place in the near future.
